The period under review can be described as one of progress focusing mainly on education and health interventions for children and youth.

As a result of the financial support received, 69 students were supported and are currently enjoying uninterrupted education at the basic, senior high and tertiary level. In addition, 18 senior high school students from the Upper East Region whose outstanding performance at the Basic Education Certificate Examination (BECE) have earned them the maiden Eastwood Anaba Scholarship Scheme.

The medical outreach programme reached out to 290 inmates and staff of the James Camp Prisons in the Greater Accra Region. 2 entrepreneurs were supported to set up their businesses. Mentoring services were provided to the Nyariga Doone Girls Junior High School with the aim of empowering them to be self-starters in whatever field they find themselves in their quest for academic excellence.

We are proud to be working with a dedicated team and caring individuals committed to ensuring that programmes for our target group are fully and well implemented. As we move forward in 2020 and beyond and with the continuous support of our donors, partners and the governing council, we are ready for the achievements ahead.

I look forward to continuing to support this great ministry and its dedicated team to achieve the mission of endowing lives of the vulnerable wherever we work.

Who we are

Social Transformation is a social intervention division of the Eastwood Anaba Ministries (EAM) a non-denominational not-for profit Christian organisation. The unit was established in 2010 to provide assistance to the needy particularly orphans and destitute in rural and deprived communities who otherwise would not have any means of equipping themselves with any productive skills.

The ministry has so far transformed hundreds of lives especially in Northern Ghana through its educational and health programmes focusing mainly on children, support for widows and supporting others in business. Our interventions are targeted primarily at empowering our beneficiaries to become self-sustaining with the ultimate aim of transforming lives of individuals, families, communities and nations.

How we work

Social Transformation sees this as an opportunity to assist in the drive to alleviate poverty in Ghana targeting deprived communities and has sought to do this through various interventions in areas especially education, health and any need that may arise especially for children. We believe that when people are educated they are better able to respond to their health needs and that of their families and contribute to the wellbeing of their communities. But the foundations of such life skills are largely set at school.

Sources of support

Funding is mainly from EAM, the President's Initiative, Fountain Gate Chapel-Desert Pastures, (FGC) and the generous support from well wishers.

INTERVENTIONS EDUCATION



Eastwood Anaba Scholarship Scheme

5 of the 10 beneficiaries of the Eastwood Anaba Scholarship instituted in 2017 for best performing BECE candidates in the Upper East Region to enable them pursue their senior high school education. These beneficiaries are now in their final year at the Bolgatanga Senior High School.

HEALTH

Medical Outreach at the James Camp Prisons

A comprehensive screening package was offered to 290 inmates and staff of the James Camp Prison and their family members. The exercise pulled together a team of 9 medical doctors, 1 physician assistant supported by 24 biomedical science students from the Radford University College.

Below are comments from some of the inmates.

1." I am extremely grateful to EAM for this comprehensive screening they have conducted for us. Though I have experienced one such screening exercise, it was just for my eyes. However, receiving this comprehensive package from you including laboratory examination coupled with the rich Word of God we received is a major blessing. The truth is I am very happy to be here at this opportune time because there is no way I could afford to do such a comprehensive health check for free".

2. "My expectation has been met fully with this screening exercise. I was infested with worms and it was really affecting my appetite as I became very nauseous after eating and was thinking of how to deworm. Your team has just brought the answer to my prayer and I bless God for that. I will however suggest that in future, you include taking of x-rays to the package".

3. "My life has been touched in a very special way with the visit by the EAM team. It started with the Word ministration where I was reassured that, though this is my second time in prison, God has not given up on me but there is still hope for me only if I'm ready to exchange my sins for the righteousness of Christ. This indeed, is reassuring and I have given my life to Christ and ready to be a changed person".

4. "The screening has been good. I had a lot of medical challenges since I came to the camp and I was happy to be given the opportunity to check my health status and assured by the team after the laboratory test that, I'm fit and healthy. God bless you for thinking about us".


Monthly Support to Needy Family



Lawrencia Anafo Ayine





The scholarship has enabled me to pursue my senior high school education. This is because I lost my dad and I am being catered for by my mum who works as a 'kavavo' (porter) in Kumasi. Though I gained admission to the Bolgatanga Senior High Secondary School, my mum could not buy my school items. Thankfully, I was selected as a recipient of the scholarship which enabled me buy a chopbox, provisions, school bag and mattress among others. This also made it possible for me to report at school on time.

I am so grateful for this kind gesture which has made it easy for me to pursue my education. May the Lord replenish all

the investment on me and also bless the ministry to enable them support other needy students".
